ORDINANCE NO. 36.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO AUTOMOBILES AND VEHICKLES OF ALL KINDS AND RELATING TO TRAFFIC RULES AND RULES OF THE ROAD.

BE IT ORDERED BY THEBOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF ARRIBA:

Section One:

It shall be unlawful for any person operating any motor vehicle or other vehicle to proceed onto or across the street in the town of Arriba commonly known and referred to as Federal Highway Number Forty North without bringing such motor vehicle or other vehicle to a complete stop before proceeding onto or across said Federal Highway Number Forty North in said town.

Section two:

Persons operating motor vehicles or other vehicles upon the street in the town of Arriba commonly known and designated as Federal Highway Number Forty North shall have the right of way over persons operating motor vehicles or other vehicles and approching said street in the town of Arriba commonly known and designated as Federal Highway Number Forty North from any direction upon any street running into and / or intersecting said street referred to and designated as Federal Highway Number Forty North in said town.

Section three:

Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of Section one of this ordinance shall upon convivtion thereof be fined for each first offense the sum of \$1.00 and shall pay the costs of the prosecution: and upon conviction of a violation of Section One a second or subsequent time shall be fined in the sum of \$3.00 and shall pay the costs of the prosecution; and any person convicted of violation of section one of this ordinance may be confined in jail until such fine and costs are paid.

Section four:

All ordinances and sections of ordinances in conflict with any of the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section five:

By reason of the fact that the Town of Arriba does not now have any adequate Ordinances or Regulations relative to motor vehicles or other vehicles moving across or onto the street in the town of Arriba designated as Federal Highway Nymber Forty North, therefore it is declared that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and shall be in full force and effect five days after its publication.
